Impact

By the end of this unit children will...

Religious Education and Prime Areas of Learning

Religious Education	Physical Development
In this unit, children will: Know that at Baptism they are given a Christian name. Be able to participate in a role-play of the celebration and identify a few. Know some symbols of Baptism. Advent- Getting Ready In this unit, children will be introduced the idea of preparing for Christmas. Children will: Know that they are getting ready for something important. Recognise the Advent Wreath as a symbol of this time.	This half term Reception will: Know what the correct pencil grip should be. Know how to correctly hold a pair of scissors. Use paintbrushes of different sizes confidently. Use scissors safely and confidently. Continue to develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient.

This half term Reception will: Listen to stories with increasing attention and recall. Show understanding of prepositions such as 'under', 'on top', 'behind' by carrying out an action or selecting correct picture. Question why things happen and gives explanations. Asks e.g. who, what, when, how?	This half term Reception will: Show perseverance in the face of a challenge. Increasingly follow rules and understand why they are important. Understand gradually how others may be feeling.

Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. Talk about some family celebrations they have experienced. Recall some important elements of firework safety. Describe people who are familiar to them.	This half term Reception will: Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. Watch and talk about dance and performance art, expressing their feelings and responses. Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.
