

Learning Project WEEK 11 – Oliver's Vegetables

Age Range: Year 1

For families with more than one child, school would suggest working as a family on one of the topics in your children's Home Learning packs.

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Set up a Prayer Service with your family, you might like to sing this song: <u>'I've got</u> <u>the joy, joy, joy down in my heart'</u> which links nicely to our Parable this week.

- <u>Listen</u> to or <u>read</u> the Parable of the Farmer and the Seeds. In this Parable we learn that when the word of God is planted in a good heart then good things will happen in the life of that person.
- Discuss: Jesus uses many different stories to teach us how we can have healthy hearts and minds. What might the birds in the story represent in our own lives? The rocky soil? How about the good soil?
- Create your own <u>farmer</u> and use this to help you retell the story.
- Create your very own seed mosaic.
- Retell the story in your own words; you could use this <u>template</u> to help you.

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Read a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be a reading a book everyday or sharing a book with an
- Listen to a story using <u>Storytime</u> or Audible.
- Use <u>Phonics Play</u> to practise your sounds daily.
- Use this <u>website</u> to practise your sounds daily.
- Listen to <u>'Oliver's Vegetables'</u>, our class story for this week.
- Use this <u>Word Mat</u> to help you retell the story to someone in your family.
- Complete this book review.
- Look at some vegetable recipes. Read the instructions together and follow the recipes to create some vegetablebased meals.
- Read these word cards carefully, can you find them in the story?

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u>. If your child works on <u>Numbots</u> in school they can access this with the same login.
- Use <u>White Rose Maths</u> Hub to access this week's Maths lessons:

Lesson 1 – make arrays

Lesson 2 – make doubles (practise your doubles to 20 here)

Lesson 3 – make equal groups (sharing) Lesson 4 – make equal groups (grouping)

- Use <u>BBC Bitesize</u> to support your learning this week.
- Complete these addition sums.
- Talk about your favourite vegetables and make a simple pictogram to show the results.

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practice letter formation when writing the <u>Year 1 Common Exception words</u>.
- Access Year 1 Spellings on <u>Twinkl</u>.
- Write a story about some magical vegetables that you grew in your garden.
- Write a shopping list of vegetables to buy at a shop.
- Create your own recipe book with your favourite vegetable recipes.
- Write a letter to Oliver and tell him some other vegetables he could plant in Grandpa's vegetable patch.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding and further explore the story: 'Oliver's Vegetables'.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

- Art 'Class Dojo' Using a range of different vegetables and coloured pencils, make some observational drawings of the different vegetables.
- <u>Music</u> Use a selection of dried peas or beans to make shakers and noisemakers. Think carefully about the sounds that you can hear.
- <u>Design Technology</u> <u>'Class Dojo'</u> Design and build a tool to dig a hole in the garden. Think about what you have available at home. How will you make it strong so you can use it lots of times? What materials will you use? Are you going to decorate it?
- <u>Science 'Class Dojo'</u> Plant some seeds / vegetables. Watch them grow and keep a diary of their progress. Design a poster all about how to plant seeds and look after them.
- <u>Geography</u> Find out about <u>where fruits and vegetables grow</u>. Do your own research and find out about a vegetable that is only grown in another country. Create your own fact file to share your learning.
- <u>History</u> Find out about the Italian Artist Giuseppe Arcimboldi, use this
 <u>PowerPoint</u> to help you. Create your own fruit / vegetable face, you could use
 crayons, felt pens, paints or collage materials. Write down two facts that you
 have found out about this artist.
- PHSE Watch this <u>video</u> of Barnaby Bear going to visit an allotment. What
 does a plant need to grow? Do you think it is important to eat fruit and
 vegetables? Complete this <u>healthy eating sorting activity</u>. Make a list of the
 advantages and disadvantages of growing our own food.

Further activities linking to 'Oliver's Vegetables'

Give the children a selection of vegetables to cut, scrape, peel or wash. Talk about the beginning of the story when Oliver only liked to eat chips. Talk about healthy eating, you could use this <u>PowerPoint</u> to help you.

You could try creating your own healthy eating lunch box for in school or at home, or even take it on a picnic!

Talk to the children about the different ways potatoes can be used to make mashed, jacket, boiled, chips. Find a recipe and make different types of potatoes during the week.

Make your own vegetable soup.

Learn about scarecrows and how they protect seeds whilst they are growing. Make your own scarecrow to put in an outside garden.
