

Learning Project WEEK 13 – The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch

Age Range: Year 1

For families with more than one child, school would suggest working as a family on one of the topics in your children's Home Learning packs.

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Set up a Prayer Service with your family.
 This week your focus could be all about Baptism, you could leave a bowl of water on a white cloth on your prayer table.

 Surround this area with the names of children in your family or class written in white against a coloured background.
- Baptism is a beginning and a welcome into the Church. Using <u>photos</u>, explore what takes places at a Baptism. You could also use this <u>website</u> for more information and some lovely craft ideas.
- Think about the Baptismal clothing. Why are clothes important to us? What do they do for us? Explain to the children that the white garment worn at Baptism is symbolic of God's love and care.
 Decorate your own white garment.
- Talk to the children about the importance of water. What do we use water for? What would we do without it? Explain that the water poured over the head at Baptism is a sign of God giving the person being Baptised a special share in his life. Can you role play a Baptism including the use of water?

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Read a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be a reading a book everyday or sharing a book with an adult.
- Listen to a story using <u>Storytime</u> or Audible.
- Use <u>Phonics Play</u> to practise your sounds daily.
- Use this <u>website</u> to practise your sounds daily.
- Read and listen to our story for this week: <u>'The Lighthouse Keeper's</u> Lunch'.
- Complete a book review.
- Decorate a chair in your home (with cushions and blankets etc.), this could be your special story telling chair! Retell the story to someone in your family.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u>. If your child works on <u>Numbots</u> in school they can access this with the same login.
- Use <u>White Rose Maths</u> Hub to access this week's Maths lessons:
 - Lesson 1 Ordering numbers
 - Lesson 2 Recognising coins
 - Lesson 3 Recognising notes
 - Lesson 4 Counting coins
- Use <u>BBC Bitesize</u> for some extra support and practise this week.

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practice letter formation when writing the Year 1 Common Exception words.
- Access Year 1 Spellings on Twinkl.
- Write a shopping list for Mrs Grinling.
- Write a recipe for something that might go into Mr Grinling's lunch.
- Write a set of instructions that help someone to make a delicious sandwich for Mr Grinling's lunch.
- Retell the story; have a go at writing some super sentences to explain what is happening in each part of the story.
- Write a new story about Fred, Tom and Bert (the seagulls) and an adventure that they might have.
- Use this <u>video</u> to help you describe the inside and outside of a lighthouse, as well as the amazing views from the top!

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding and further explore the story: 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

 <u>Music</u> – Listen to the song '<u>Beside the Seaside</u>' and see if you can learn the words and tune.

Make sound effects to go along with the story. What could you use to make a seagull noise? What could you use to make the sound of the basket moving along the rope?

<u>Art</u> – Make your own seaside in a bottle, here is a <u>PowerPoint</u> to help.

Look at some <u>beach hut art work</u>. Can you make your own picture with a row of beach huts that are all different?

- <u>Design Technology</u> Make a junk model lighthouse. Can you use a torch as the light?
- <u>History</u> Find out about the history of lighthouses. Why were they built? Where are they located?
- Geography Use a map / atlas / google maps to look for the locations of lighthouses.
- <u>PHSE ('Class Dojo')</u> Explore <u>Picture News</u> and choose an activity to complete.
 Share your activity on Class Dojo.
