

Learning Project WEEK 1 – London and Brazil Age Range: Year 2	
 Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day) Write a prayer for Lent asking God for forgiveness and helping us to forgive those who may have done something mean to us. Talk to your child about Lent and ask them to write down what they know, they can use words and pictures. Have a look at some pictures of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (use google images). Ask your child to recreate one of the pictures with pencils, paint etc. Explain what they know about Reconciliation (It is a special moment when we celebrate God's forgiveness) Ask your child to write down their own thoughts about forgiveness. Do they think it is important to forgive others and why? What does God teach us about forgiveness? 	 Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. Complete a task from their reading journal. Share a child with your child and talk about what had happened in the story. Write a book review of the story. Make a bookmark with characters from their favourite story.
 Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u>. If your child works on <u>Numbots</u> in school they can access this with the same login. Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Practise counting in 2's, 5's, 10's and 3's. Use sweets, buttons, pencils etc. to help to do this. Make a shopping list together and create a price for each item. Ask your child to work out how much 2 of the items will cost, how much 3 items would cost etc. Column addition and number lines will help them to do this. Write the number to 100 and then see how many they can write in words in 2 minutes. 	 Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day) Ask your child to write a list of tourist attractions in London (they will know quite a lot already). You can research them together on the internet. Then write a brief description of 3 of them. We have been learning about London and Brazil in school, ask your child to write a short story about a child from Brazil visiting London. What sights will they see? What adventure might they have? Write postcard home from the child who is vising London explaining their feelings about London and describing what a wonderful time they are having. Draw a picture of the Brazilian Carnival and label it with lots of adjectives. Practise spelling the days of the week and the months of the year.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of comparing two cities in the world.

- <u>Music -</u> As your child to clap out the syllables in the song to the tune of London's Burning.
 <u>Rhino song</u>
- <u>Art -</u> Using pens, pencils, paint, fabric and glue etc. design their own costume for the Brazilian Carnival. The more colourful the better!
- <u>Design Technology</u> Using any empty shoe box or cereal box, ask your child to design one of the rooms on the International Space Station (they drew some designs in school last week). They can use smaller boxes and junk modelling equipment to make it or they can cut parts out of card or paper.
- <u>Science</u> Last week were looking at space in school and the children designed their own International Space Station. Ask your child to plan their own journey into space. What would they take with them? What would they wear? (They could design their own space suit thinking carefully about what it would be made out of). What do think it will be like in space?
- <u>History</u> Ask your child to research the Royal family. Draw one of the members of the Royal family and write a brief description of them and where they live in the country. (See link to 'Twinkl' below which has lots of help and ideas)
- <u>Geography</u> Ask your child to draw a simple map of London with the river Thames winding down the middle and then draw on the main tourist attractions around it. (See link to 'Twinkl' below which has lots of help and ideas)
- <u>PHSE</u> Ask your child to design an internet safety poster telling other children how to stay safe online and what to do if they feel unhappy with something they have seen online.
