



Learning Project WEEK 3 – Towers, Tunnels and Turrets

Age Range: Year 2

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read Luke 24: 1-12. Discuss with your child the reasons why the Resurrection of Jesus is one of the most important stories in the Gospel. Watch the story of the Resurrection and write down a description of what Mary Magdalene saw at the tomb and what happened. If you were at the tomb at the same time as Peter, what questions would you be asking? Write a letter to a friend explaining what happened at the tomb and how it made you feel. Also, tell your friend about how the disciples would have felt. Draw a picture of Mary and Jesus. Write next to your picture why you think Mary didn't recognize Jesus at first. In what way do you think Jesus was different? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. Complete a task from their reading journal. Listen to a story read: https://www.storylineonline.net/ After you have listened to a story being read, re-write the story in your own words. Think carefully about the beginning, the middle and the end. Remember that you don't need to include every detail, just the main events in the story. Draw 2 characters from the story and using speech bubbles, write down what they might have said to each other.
Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Working on Times Table Rockstars. If your child works on Numbots in school they can access this with the same login. Play on Hit the Button - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Play the mental maths train game about using the four operation. Complete the addition and subtraction activity online. Play some division games with your family. Get some sweets, beads, pencils etc from around your house and share them between the people in your house or between you and 2 of your teddies. How many do you have each? How many are left over? 	<p>Over the next few weeks you are going to create a fact file about castles! Each week you will create a page for your fact file. Your tasks for this week are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Research castles on the internet, draw one and label the different parts. Write next to each part a short description of each part and what it is used for. Add adjectives to your castle picture and use your adjectives to write short sentences to describe your castle. Create the front cover for your fact file. Complete the activities on compound words. Spelling activities.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of comparing two cities in the world.

- **Music**

Listen to some [medieval music](#). What instruments can you hear?

- **Art**

Sketch or paint a picture of your favourite castle in England.

- **Design Technology**

Design and make, using what ever materials you may have, a model of a castle. May sure you include all of the [parts of the castle](#). This will be an on-going project for the next few weeks.

- **Science**

Watch the science clip about the [types of foods that animals eat](#). Then write down what carnivores, herbivores and omnivores eat.

- **History**

Use the internet (with an adult present) to research castles in England (you can combine geography and history together). Find out which castle in England is the oldest and draw a picture of it.

- **Geography**

Use the internet (with an adult present) to research castles in England. How many are there? Can you make a list of 10 castles and write down where they are in England? You could even draw a map of England and put eh castles onto the map.

- **PHSE**

Create a poster about the people in our community that help us. Who are our key workers? What do they do? How do they help us?
