

Learning Project WEEK 6 – Towers, Tunnels and Turrets

Age Range: Year 2

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)

- Make a colourful picture of the word 'promise' and write around it what you think 'promise' means.
- Watch the video or read a story about <u>Noah and the flood</u>. What promise did God make to Noah?
- Think about the promises you have made. Did you keep them? Were they easy to keep?
- Watch the video about <u>Pentecost</u>. What promise did Jesus fulfill on the day of Pentecost? What promise had he made?
- Thinking about Pentecost, what were the disciples like before the Holy Spirit came? Can you think of lots of different words for this.

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.
- Complete a task from their reading journal.
- Listen to a story read: https://www.storylineonline.net/
- Read the story on the last page of this document about 'Billy the Brave Knight'.
- Draw a picture of Gemima, Trotty and Will from the story and make a list of adjectives to describe them. Think carefully about what you think they are like.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u>. If your child works on <u>Numbots</u> in school they can access this with the same login.
- Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.
- Play the mental maths train game about using the four operation.
- Complete the <u>addition and subtraction</u> <u>activity</u> online.
- (please continue these lessons) There are now daily lessons available for you to follow with your child. Each day's work has a power point, activities and an answer sheet. Please don't feel that your child has to complete all of the activity sheet, just let your child do as much as they are able to. Please click on the following link: Maths lessons.

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Over the next few weeks you are going to create a fact file about castles! Each week you will create a page for your fact file. Your tasks for this week are:

- Look at the information about knights.
 Draw the picture of the knight on the horse, don't forget to label your picture.
- Write a description of what a knight wears and why you think he wears it.
- Watch the video about <u>commas in a</u> <u>sentence</u> and then complete the activity below the video.
- Complete the activity on contractions.
- Play the <u>plural game</u>.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of medieval times.

• Music

Can you write your own positivity song about staying happy and positive?

• Art

Design your own knight's uniform. Draw the picture of your knight in uniform and think carefully about what colours you are going to use.

• Design Technology

Design and make, using what ever materials you may have, a model of a castle. May sure you include all of the <u>parts of the castle</u>. This will be an on-going project for the next few weeks.

• Science

Watch the video clip about an ocean habitat and complete the activities below.

• History

Use the internet (with an adult present) to research a knight's clothing. What did they wear and why? (Link this with your English work)

Geography

Using the internet find out which castles are along the coast line. Can you draw them on a map?
