<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Think about the symbols that you see in the church. Make a sketch of some of them. • Watch the Bible story about the conversion of St. Paul. What was he like before and after his conversion? What words can you think of to describe him? • Draw a picture of St. Paul before his conversion and one after it. • St. Paul wrote many letters encouraging people to follow Jesus. What do you he wrote in his letters? • Pretend to be St. Paul and write a letter encouraging people to follow Jesus. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. • Complete a task from their reading journal. • Listen to a story read: https://www.storylineonline.net/ • Read chapters 4 and 5 of the 'The Worst Zoo in the World' and answer the questions that follow.

If your child works on Numbots in school they can access this with the same login. • Play on Hit the Button - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. • Play the mental maths train game about using the four operation. • Complete the addition and subtraction activity online. • We will now be using 'Oak Academy' online lessons which provide lessons and activities which can be completed online.
