Famous people

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read this week's reading in your homework diary. What is the message? How is it relevant to us today? Write a prayer service for your family. Watch Faith at Home – Patience Read Matthew 3 13-17 or watch 'The Baptism of Jesus'. Discuss that Baptism is the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit. What do you think the Holy Spirit can do to help you? Make a paper dove like one of these. Why is the dove important in the Baptism story? When have we read about doves in the Bible before? (Class Dojo) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world. Complete an activity in your reading journal as soon as you've finished reading a book. Revise how to use a dictionary using BBC Bitesize. Use your dictionary or Google to explore the meanings of words in a poem. You could use this lesson to help.
Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Working on Times Table Rockstars your child will have an individual login to access this (20 mins on Garage). Play on Hit the Button - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables Play Solvemoji. How high up the leaderboard can you get? Use these rhymes to help you learn your 7 times table or sing along to this song. Learn all about equivalent fractions with BBC Bitesize. Revise what you have learnt about parallel and perpendicular lines. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continue your journal. What has changed in your life or the country or the world over the last week? Try today's spelling activity on Classroom Secrets Kids or the matching spelling games assigned to our class. Write a letter to your favourite author telling them what you like about their books and what else you would like the characters to do. Think of your favourite place to visit. Design a leaflet to encourage other people to go there. Remember to include all the exciting thing they can do. Choose a famous person you admire. Write a list of questions you would like to ask them. You could answer in the role of your hero. Ensure you use a range of question words. Design a card celebrating a religious celebration, remember to include a poem/verse for inside. You could make either an Easter, Baptism, Diwali card etc....(Class Dojo)

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of portraits.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

- **Music –** This [song](#) will help you to remember what parallel and perpendicular lines are. Make sure you do the actions with your arms too!
- **Art –** using a mirror, sketch a portrait of yourself in pencil. Remember when you sketch to draw very lightly and then go over with more pressure over the lines you want to use. (Class Dojo)
- **Design Technology –** design a frame for your self portrait. It must include objects/pictures/ themes that tell people all about you eg it could be your favourite colour with pictures of your favorite animals. (Class Dojo)
 - **Science –** Complete one of the Crest Home Learning [investigations](#).
 - **History –** Find out about Pablo Picasso. Why was he famous? When and where did he live?
 - **Geography –** Vincent Van Gough was famous for painting self portraits. Can you find out about where he lived?
 - **PHSE –** Discuss the different feelings that we have. How do we express them? What do our faces look like for different feelings and how can we recognise them in others?
