Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. • Read a book from Epic. The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of rivers.

- **Art –** Monet was famous for painting water like this picture of the Thames.

- **Design Technology –** design and make a [marble run](#). What have you learnt that helps you to understand how rivers flow? (Class Dojo)

- **History –** Find out why the [River Nile](#) was so important to Ancient Egyptians.

- **Geography –** find out how rivers are formed. This BBC Bitesize [lesson](#) will help.

Which of these things are you as a family going to continue to do now things are returning to normal? Eg continue with daily walks or play more family board games.
