Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul> <li>Read this week's reading in your homework diary. What is the message? How is it relevant to us today?</li> <li>Write a prayer service for your family.</li> <li>Watch Faith at Home</li> <li>One of the ways that the Holy Spirit works in the lives of Jesus' followers is to bring peace. Find synonyms and antonyms for the word 'peace'.</li> <li>Use the worksheet on Class Dojo – class story to describe what peace is.</li> <li>Use the information from your worksheet to create a poster explaining 'Peace is)(Class Dojo)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.</li> <li>Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.</li> <li>Read a book from <u>Epic</u>. Try something different to what you would normally read.</li> <li>Complete an activity in your reading journal as soon as you've finished reading a book.</li> <li>Think of a book you have read or are currently reading; research something from the book that you do not know much about eg a place or an event in history, to increase your understanding of the story. (Class Dojo)</li> <li>Learn how to find the facts you need from instructions.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> your child will have an individual login to access this (20 mins on Garage).</li> <li>Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables</li> <li>Play <u>Solvemoji</u>, How high up the leaderboard can you get?</li> <li>Have a look at this <u>imoves video</u> to help practise your times tables. (Class Dojo)</li> <li>Learn about different types of angles with this <u>lesson</u>. Where can you find right angles, acute angles and obtuse angles in your house?</li> <li>Compare capacity and volumes with this Oak Academy <u>lesson</u></li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Continue your journal. What has changed in your life or the country or the world over the last week?</li> <li>Use your research from the science activity to write an explanation of the Water Cycle. (Class Dojo)</li> <li>Play Wordworm to help practise spellings or choose 5 words from the Year 3 and 4 common exception words and write them in pyramid writing.</li> <li>Write a quiz for your family about something you know lots about – maybe a sport or TV program for example.</li> <li>Plan and write a story about a journey down the river. Where is the main character going and why? What happens on his/her journey? How do they overcome this?</li> </ul>

## Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of rivers.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

• <u>Music –</u> Listen to this very famous piece of music called '<u>The Blue Danube</u>'. Find out which country the Danube is in and who composed the music.

• <u>Art – Monet was famous for painting water like this picture of the Thames.</u>



Find out more about him <u>here.</u> Have a go at creating a picture in a similar style – using small dabs of paint and painting outside! (Class Dojo)

• <u>Design Technology</u> – design and make a marble run. What have you learnt that helps you to understand how rivers flow? (Class Dojo)

- <u>Science</u> Where is fresh water on the Earth found? Use this <u>lesson</u> to help you find out and learn about the Water Cycle.
- <u>History</u> Find out why the <u>River Nile</u> was so important to Ancient Egyptians.
- <u>Geography</u> find out how rivers are formed. This BBC Bitesize <u>lesson</u> will help.
- <u>PHSE –</u> Discuss what you have found most challenging over the last few weeks and what you have found the most helpful. Which of these things are you as a family going to continue to do now things are returning to normal? Eg continue with daily walks or play more family board games. Write a pledge as a family, recording all of things that you will continue in the future.
