Age Range: Year 3

Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)

Read this week's reading in your homework diary. What is the message? How is it relevant to us today?

- Write a prayer service for your family.
- Watch Faith at Home
- Thinking about celebrations what do we do to celebrate? What activities do we take part in? Who is with us? Make a mind map with all your ideas. (Class Dojo)
- Mass is a celebration. Which of the ideas from your mind map do we do during Mass? How are they the same and how are they different?
- Thanksgiving is an important part of celebration. What do we thank God for during Mass and how do we show thanks?

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.
- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read.
 Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Read a book from <u>Epic</u>. Try something different to what you would normally read.
- Complete an activity in your reading journal as soon as you've finished reading a book.
- Listen to two extracts from 'A Midsummer's Night Dream' and use the information you know to make predictions about what happens next.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> your child will have an individual login to access this (20 mins on Garage).

- Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables
- Play <u>Solvemoji</u>, How high up the leaderboard can you get?
- Have a look at this <u>imoves video</u> to help practise your times tables. (Class Dojo)

- Play <u>Wordworm</u> to help practise spellings or choose 5 words from the Year 3 and 4 common exception words and write them in pyramid writing.
- Write a letter to yourself in 2 years time. What would you like to remember about now? What would you like to be different in 2 years?
- Watch 'Lucas the Spider Polar <u>Bear'</u>. Write a story from Lucas's point of view when he sees a cat for the first time. What might he think it is? (Class Dojo)
- Write a recount of an occasion this year that you have celebrated. Was if different to normal? How?

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of Celebrations.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

- <u>Music</u> Watch the Go Noodle 'Celebrate' song. Can you write your own celebration song?
- <u>Art Have a go at 'The Circle Challenge'</u> Use 6 different sized circular objects to create a range of sketches that include circles. (Class Dojo)
- <u>Design Technology</u> Design and make a board game with a celebration theme.
 Will it be for one type of celebration or different ones? Will you need a dice and cards?
- <u>Science</u> –. Diwali is a Hindu celebration –the Festival of Lights. Hindus make patterns from coloured rice during this time. Look out for a science experiment using rice on Class Dojo class story.
- <u>History</u> St George's Day is celebrated on the 23rd April. Research why and create a timeline of his life. (Class Dojo)
- <u>Geography</u> How are birthdays celebrated around the world? Look at this
 <u>website</u> to find out information on the celebrations. Create fact files to show the
 similarities and differences between the celebrations.

- Look through old photos of previous celebrations the family have taken part in. What
 can you remember about the event? Discuss why the family celebrates in this way.
 Do you have any family traditions? How have you had to celebrate differently this
 year?
