# Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Write a list of all the things you are grateful for – one for every letter of the alphabet.
- Read this week's reading in your homework diary. What is the message? How is it relevant to us today?
- Write and carry out a prayer service for your family. What do you need to include?
- Find out facts about St George.
- Imagine that you were a news reporter present for Jesus' arrival on Palm Sunday. Create either a TV news report or a newspaper report describing the event. What names was Jesus called by the crowd?
- Can you complete this crossword about the Last Supper? Use your bible to help.

- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.
- Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read.
   Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.
- Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.
- Read a poem. What type is it? Can you see a rhyming pattern? Try this Allen Ahlberg <u>poem</u>.
- Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?
- Complete an activity in your reading journal as soon as you've finished reading a book.
- Complete the <u>reading</u> task from the National Academy

#### Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> your child will have an individual login to access this (30 mins on Garage).
- Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables
- Look at writing 3 digit numbers in words and numbers. Use BBC <u>Bitesize</u> to help you.
- Play <u>Solvemoji</u>, Can you move up a level?
- Keep practising the 8 times table.
   Use this <u>song</u> to help you.
- Look at unit fractions using this lesson from Oak National Academy.

# Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Continue your journal. What have you enjoyed about the last week?
   What did you find challenging?
- Download and complete spelling activities for this week at twinkl or practise spellings on ICT games – year 3/4 words
- Practise using adjectives by playing
   The Minister's Cat. The first person
   starts off by describing the minister's
   cat with an adjective that begins with
   the letter "A." For example, "The
   minister's cat is an angry cat." The
   next player uses an adjective that
   begins with "B" and so on through the
   alphabet. "
- Write a story using these 5 words: apple, train, elephant, paper, banjo.
- Rewrite the ending of your favorite story. For example, what would have happened if Cinderella had not lost her glass slipper?
- Draw a scientific diagram of the life <u>cycle of a plant</u> then add labels and captions to explain what happens.

### **Learning Project - to be done throughout the week**

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of plants.

- <u>Music –</u> watch this <u>video</u> about using trees to make music. Close your eyes to listen to the music. What does it make you think of?
- <u>Art –</u> make a picture using natural objects in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. Like this!
- <u>Design Technology</u> design a spring wreath using plants and flowers found at this time of year. Here is an example that you could make.
- Science- investigate what conditions plants need to grow.
- History find out about prehistoric plants.
  - Geography where in the world would you find the world's biggest plants?
     What are they and exactly how big are they? Find their location on a world map.
  - <u>PHSE –</u> Discuss the importance of teamwork. What skills and qualities do you have that make you a good team player? Use these <u>Bitesize</u> videos to help you.
