## Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of plants.

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

- <u>Music</u> Make you own musical instruments out of objects you can find at home. Can you use it to play along with this <u>desert</u> themed music?
- <u>Art –</u> Collect stones from the garden or when out on a walk and paint them to



look like cactus like these.

- <u>Design Technology</u> A Rain stick is a percussion instrument that is made from a dried cactus branch that is hollowed out and filled with small pebbles. Design and make your own <u>rain stick</u> using a cardboard tube, foil and dried seeds or pebbles. (Class Dojo)
- <u>Science</u> Find out how plants adapt to extreme temperatures. Use this <u>lesson</u> to help.
- <u>History</u> Find out how the Ancient Egyptians were able to grow food even though they lived in a desert. This website might help. What do you know about what plants need to survive that could help you?
- <u>Geography</u> On a map, find which areas of the world have deserts. Does a desert have to be hot and sandy? What types of plants grow there?
