Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of animals, including humans.

• <u>Music</u>

Class Dojo': Learn the lyrics to the 'Food Chain Song' (below) sing along to the tune of 'Frosty the Snowman'. Create your own actions to the song.

• <u>Art/Design Technology</u>

Create your own food chain tubes. Sketch 5 animals that would belong to a food chain (to include producer, prey, consumer and predator). Construct 5 tubes to put your animals onto.

• <u>Science</u>

Class Dojo': What do you notice when looking at the boiled egg with shells in the water, cola, orange juice

and milk? Make a note of your observation. 7 days after putting the eggs into the liquids, take the eggs out of the cup. Were you correct with your predictions? What was the effect each drink had on the liquids? Explain why you think these changes occurred.

• <u>History</u>

Read the news article on the impact of deforestation in the rainforest on the rainforest over the last few years. What will happen if the deforestation continues into the future? The article will be posted on Class Dojo.

<u>Geography</u>

'Class Dojo': Research different animals that live in the rainforest. Find out where they live in the rainforest and what their diets consist of. Draw a food chain of some of the animals that live in the rainforest.

Discuss your feelings since lockdown. What have you found most challenging? What have you really enjoyed? What do you hope you will continue to do as a family? What are you hoping to do over the summer holidays?
