Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a prayer to thank God for all He has done for us during this difficult time. • Identify and order the events of Holy Week, from Palm Sunday to the Death and Burial of Jesus. • Read the different accounts of Holy Week from the four Gospels. What are the similarities and differences between the accounts? Why do you think that there are some differences? • Research some people in the Holy Week story who were opposed to Jesus. Find out about the Pharisees, Sadducees and Priests. Why might have they been glad to see Jesus put to death? • Prepare a prayer service about Holy Week with your family. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read a chapter your home reading book or a book that you have borrowed from the library. • Find a story on Newsround relating to the environment; discuss the story with your family. Play one of the games or quizzes about the environment, e.g. 'Plastic Planet Marine Rescue'. • Access the free book resource to read a book about the seas, oceans or environment. Afterwards, write down 5 facts you have learnt. • Complete the comprehension activity about rubbish and the environment. • Challenge yourself to read something that isn't a book, can you create clues to explain what you have read?

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Log-on to Times Table Rockstars. You can also access Numbots with the same login. • Practise your division facts by playing 'Hit the Button'. • Take part in the lessons provided by Carol Vorderman in the form of accessing the videos and activities. • Play 'The Tray Game' with your family. Collect 10-20 small items from around your home and place them on a tray. After 2 minutes, cover the tray. How many items can you remember? • Go on a maths treasure hunt inside your home or in the garden. What examples of maths can you find? Create clues for family members to search for the objects. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a diary entry about your daily home learning activities to be used in history one day to show what happened during this period. • Write your own story about an adventure in the deep blue sea. Create your own underwater character, and consider what other creatures they may come across. Think about what events could happen in your story. • Read through the story of 'The King of the Fishes' and complete two of the activities in the booklet. • Have a go at the quiz to show your understanding of using apostrophes for plural possession. • Practise your weekly spellings and choose an activity to complete.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of seas and oceans.

- **Music**

Listen to the song '[Under the Sea](#)' from 'The Little Mermaid'. Create your own song or rap about the sea.

- **Art**

Sketch some different creatures you would find living in the seas and oceans.

- **Design Technology**

Create your own or find a recipe inspired by the sea, cook a meal and have your own 'Under the Sea' dinner party at home.

- **Science**

Learn about the importance of washing our hands through a [soapy investigation](#) to ensure harmful dirt and germs are washed away properly.

- **History**

Research about ocean exploration. Can you create a timeline?

- **Geography**

Have a go at one of the [quizzes](#) about changes to the environment.

- **PHSE**

Discuss the statement: 'People should be allowed to fish as much as they want to.' Discuss this statement with your family and construct reasons 'for' and 'against'. Justify your own overall opinion.
