Age Range: Year 5

### Weekly RE Tasks (Aim to do one per day)

What does the word "responsibility" mean? Read the Passage from St. Paul (1 Corinthians 12: 12 – 27) about the Church being the body of Christ and everybody having a part to play. this. What does it mean? Does it say that only some people have been called to a special task in the life of the Church? Do you think that following Christ and taking on a responsibility in the Church is something that is easy?

How can you show that you belong to the Church and what can you do? 'Class Dojo'

At various times in life we are called upon to make promises. When? God made a promise to Abraham about being a great nation. What promise did God make to Noah? When have we ever made a promise? Are some promises easier to keep than others?

Promises are made during the Sacrament of Marriage, research promises made during the marriage ceremony in a Catholic Church. What sort of commitment is required from a man and woman getting married?

Read the <u>prayer of Tobias and Sarah</u> on the eve of their Marriage in the Book of Tobit. What are some of the things they ask God to do for them? What does this prayer teach us about Marriage?

## **Learning Project - to be done throughout the week**

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of the Key Events in WWII

Some of these tasks will be set via 'Class Dojo' during the week – please complete them online, as teachers will be able to provide feedback.

- <u>History ('Class Dojo')</u> Complete the World War II activity timeline sheet this

Research one of the key events during World War II: The Battle of Britain, The bombing of Pearl Harbour, The Dambusters Raid or The Normandy Landings, and then present your learning. This could be in the form of a power point, a written report, a poster or information leaflet.

- <u>Art ('Class Dojo')</u> This lesson is linked to your History work. After researching one of the key events create a piece of art work to depict this event.
- <u>Design Technology ('Class Dojo')</u> Operation Chastise was an attack on German dams carried out on 16–17 May 1943 by Royal Air Force No. 617 Squadron, later called the Dam Busters, using a purpose-built "bouncing bomb "developed by Barnes Wallis.

Create your own replica bouncing bomb.

• <u>Science ('Class Dojo')</u> – Research 'Pehr Henrik Ling' and create a fact file about him.
