<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For centuries different titles have been given to Mary Our Mother, to describe the person she is. Research and create a list of these titles. Can you create an image of the Annunciation of Mary? Use speech and thought bubbles to show what people may have said or thought. What happened during the Visitation of Mary? Who did she visit and why? Create a short story of your own to explain what happened. The Nativity story tells us what happened in the build-up and aftermath of Jesus' birth. Can you create your own storyboard or comic strip to show the elements of this important story? Create your own prayer to Mary Our Mother, think about the Hail Mary and elements of this that you may wish to include. Write out the Hail Mary in your own way, be as creative as you like. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read a chapter from your home reading book or a book of your own choosing. Make a prediction at the end of your reading as to what will happen next. Complete a chosen activity from your home reading journal. Design another activity to add to our journals in the future. What is the difference between fact and opinion?
